## CRSP SURVIVOR-BIAS-FREE US MUTUAL FUND DATABASE

These Release Notes accompany the April 2018 quarterly release of the CRSP Survivor-Bias-Free US Mutual Fund Database, and contain data through March 2018.

## NOTES

- In this release, historical daily NAV values were added where previously only the weekly NAV values were available. Over 18,000 daily NAV values were added to the Daily_Nav table. Similarly, nearly 1,000 historical dividend values for JPM and Vanguard funds were added to the Dividends table.
- Full mapping of EDGAR database to crsp_fundno for 1000 funds has been completed. Series_CIK and Contract_CIK identifiers were added where only the Company_CIK was previously published in the CRSP_CIK_Map table. CIK mapping research will continue and the results should be posted in the next quarter's release.


## FILE VERSION SPECIFICS

The database has 64,731 total funds. Of these 33,059 are active and 31,672 are delisted.

The 33,059 active mutual fund classes are assets within 12,181 unique mutual funds (determined by unique crsp_cl_grp).

The 31,672 inactive mutual fund classes are assets within 16,322 unique mutual funds (determined by unique crsp_cl_grp).

The biggest table is HOLDINGS with 177,701,101 rows.
The mutual fund database is available in SAS and ASCII formats and as a CRSPAccess database for access through CRSPSift for Windows.

## SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

- SAS version 8, SAS version 9.1, or a relational database of your choice.
- Sufficient disk space to load and manipulate the database:

## GENERAL NOTES:

- A blank field means either that data was not applicable to a fund or that data is not available.
- A field with a "?" in it is a flag to indicate further research is required.
- A field has a zero in it when 1) The fund did not exist; 2) No value could be found; or 3) A calculated value could not be calculated because information was missing.

## INSTALLS AND DATA FORMATS

## ZIP INSTALLS

CRSP uses a zip process for data installation. ZIP utilities that are standard on all platforms should work to unzip the databases. On Windows computers, CRSP recommends using 7-ZIP, which can be downloaded from this site: http:// www.7-zip.org/
Several important items to note follow:

- All directories are extracted to lower case letters. For example: C:Icrspdatalmiz201308
- All Windows Users: Extracting a zipped file does not create an installed program in Windows. It will not show in the Windows Control Panel. When uninstalling the data, just delete the directories that contain the detailed files
- Red Hat Linux Users: If your version of Red Hat is earlier than 6.0, you will need to install an updated version of the "File Roller" program in order to install the data


## STEPS TO INSTALL

- From the directory containing your downloaded zip file, right click (in Windows) or run File Roller (in Red Hat)
- Set the extract destination to the current higher level directory where data is normally stored and unzip will add the rest of the path (default is $\mathrm{C}:$ I in Windows or /home in Red Hat) For example, in Windows, extracting to C:I will install the data under C:Icrspdata
